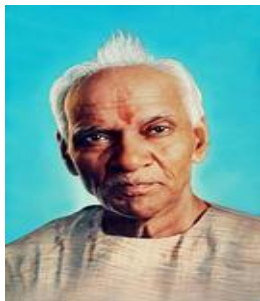
Introduction to Vyas Muni

- Around some 5000 years ago, he was born on an island on the holy river Yamuna.
- His father was Parashar Rishi, a sage and his mother was Satyawati.
- Vyas Muni was the first and greatest Acharya of Sanatan Dharma
- He was the grandfather of the Pandavas and Kauravas.

Accomplishments of Vyas Muni

- He split the single Veda into four Vedas (Rigved, Samved, Yajurved and Atharvaved).
- Lord Ganesh helped Vyas Muni write the verses.
- He wrote Mahabharata, the epic in which he was a character.
- He wrote 4 Vedas, 108 Upanishads and 18 Puranas

- Gurudev translated the Vedas, Puranas and Upanishads into simple language—with no help.
- He wrote the 19th Puran called Pragy Puran and the Pragyopnishad Upanishad.
- He also wrote 6 Darshans, 20 Smrutiya, Yog Vasistha, Gita VishwaKosh (18 Volumes), and 108 Volumes of Vangmaya.
- Therefore, Gurudev is called as “YUG RISHI” and “Ved Murti”
